The classroom can sometimes be a frustrating environment for pupils that cannot hold a book or read print. Difficulty with reading can affect language and communication skills, increase anxiety and depression, and lead to feelings of isolation in class.



Audiobooks are an exciting, **inclusive way to learn**, allowing children to concentrate on the book's content, rather than the process of reading. Listening to audiobooks can also

increase literacy and communication skills. They allow students to keep up with the books their peers are reading and can help **encourage reading for pleasure.** At Listening Books, we believe strongly that all children and young adults should be able to access books, and through our audiobook collection offer a wide range of books for both leisure and learning. We record many titles for education in our own recording studios with professional actors. These titles not only support the English curriculum, but many other subjects such as History, Science, Maths, Geography, Drama and PHSE.

Benefits of Using Audiobooks at home or at school

There are many benefits to using audiobooks, both at home or in the classroom. Listening to audiobooks eliminates the struggle some may have 'decoding' the words on the page, allowing the listener to visualise as they listen. Their understanding is

also helped by the tone of voice, accent, emphasis and timing given to the text by the professional reader.

Many children can miss out on vital language resources and their written output can fail to reflect their ability. Listening to books in audio form can help them acquire not only a whole new range of experience, but a vocabulary beyond their own reading level and everyday conversation, **enhancing fluency and comprehension**. Their horizons expand, they absorb the structure and conventions of storytelling and develop much greater confidence to communicate both orally and on paper, which has enormous benefits to their writing. When they discover the excitement of books through listening, pupils want to read more rather than less. If they follow the text while listening, their word recognition and reading speed improve.

Our audiobook collection supports the Curriculum, covering subjects including Geography, Science, Citizenship and History, as well as titles that support mental health such as Looking After Your Mental Health by Alice James and Louie Stowell, recorded inhouse in our state-of-the-art studios as part of our Sound Learning programme.

Through Sound Learning, we are able to record a wide range of educational titles that are unavailable in the audiobook format, which means you will find titles in our collection that are unavailable anywhere else.

The Service We Offer

Our audiobooks can be borrowed online and either streamed live or downloaded to a portable player. There are no late fees and books will automatically return themselves at the end of the lending period, unless you choose to return a title early.

We add new titles every month and our friendly library team are on hand to help with any questions Monday-Friday 9am – 5pm.
